

1st Gangnam International Healthy Cities Symposium



June 7-8, 2007

Co-organized by Graduate School of Public Health, Seoul National University Gangnam District, one of the 25 sub districts of Seoul Metropolitan Government, initiated its Healthy Cities Project in 2005. After joining the Alliance for Healthy Cities(AFHC) in July, 2005, Gangnam District has implemented a Healthy Schools Project with Hakdong Elementary School. Even before announcing to be a "healthy city", Gangnam has shown efforts in promoting a healthier environment for its residents. For example, as a result of a ten-year effort, Yangjae stream has transformed from a polluted stream to an eco-friendly outdoor recreational area. More plans are still being built to further encourage Yangjae stream.

Currently there are 23 Korean full members in the AFHC. The Korean Partnership for Healthy Cities (the Korean national network for HC) was established in September 2006. In response to this expedient interest in the Healthy Cities Movement, Gangnam took the initiative to host an international symposium to bring Korean healthy cities together and to learn from each other.

The 1st Gangnam International Healthy Cities Symposium was hosted and funded by the Gangnam District Government and was co-organized with the Graduate School of Public Health, Seoul National University. It was successfully held on June 7-8, 2007 in the Seoul Trade and Exhibition Center(SETEC), Gangnam District with the theme "Building Partnerships for Active Healthy Cities". The symposium was attended by 460 participants from public health centers, universities, research institutes and the private sector. Six distinguished international speakers were invited to share experiences from WHO, Australia, Germany, Hong Kong, Japan and Malaysia.
