Profile of Islands District

Islands District is the largest administrative districts in Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR), covering an area of about 175 km² and has a population of around 137,000 (as at 2006). It consists of some twenty large and small islands which lie to the south and southwest of the HKSAR. The outlying islands are notable for a more relaxed way of life than that of the rest of the HKSAR.

The District is a treasure-house in terms of archaeological finds. Various Chinese festivals are celebrated in the District throughout the year, attracting thousands of local and overseas visitors. All these add to the beautiful scenery and natural landscape which can be found all over the Islands District. As a result, the District is considered as one of the most preferred locations in the HKSAR for hiking and camping.

Tung Chung is the new developing town on the Lantau Island of the Islands District. With the support from District Council, local public and private organizations, institutions and government bodies, Tung Chung has been designated as a "safe community" by the World Health Organization (WHO) since 2006. The designation recognizes the efforts of Islands District in fostering safe and healthy culture within the community.
